Course Overview:

This course will provide nurses with a basic understanding of the complexity of Lyme disease. Attendees will learn how *Borrelia burgdorferi*, the agent of Lyme disease, is transmitted to humans and the potential effects it may have on patients; other tick-borne diseases will also be discussed. Treatment strategies will be reviewed. This course will be appropriate for RNs, LPNs, medical assistants, and other allied health professionals.

- Understand the microbiology and transmission of Lyme disease
- Learn fundamental details regarding other tick-borne infections
- Understand which antibiotic are used in Lyme disease and why controversy over treatment strategies exists.
